# STEM Academy Head of School Update

Good Evening STEM Academy Families,

Thank you to everyone that came out for Back to School Night last evening. It was great to see so many faces moving throughout the building.

As a reminder, we will begin the Lunch & Learn Schedule, this Tuesday, September 20th. Below you will find the bell schedule for Lunch and Learn going forward to keep for future reference: Lunch and Learn Bell Schedule. This information can also be accessed on the STEM Academy Website: School Day. The Lunch & Learn days are as follows: A, D, E, H, I, L (or all 1-7 days).

As a reminder, from approximately 11:00 am -12:00 pm, on days A, D, E, H, I and L, students will have one hour to meet teachers for help, work with partners on projects, engage in some sort of physical activity if they choose, make up assessments, enjoy some fresh air in the stadium, and eat lunch. We are all excited for our Lunch and Learn model to begin because all students will have access to all of their teachers 6 out of 12 days in a cycle during this time. There are just a few items that we need to remind our students of:

- 1: If we all try to eat lunch at the beginning of Lunch and Learn the lines will be long. Even though we have two additional serving spaces for a total of four it is important for students to manage their time to accomplish what they need to accomplish.
- 2: Students should check their teacher's availability and location on Schoology as each teacher will be assigned a 30 minutes period to be available for help. These 30 minute periods are labeled Learn 1 and Learn 2.
- 3: We will need students to continue the wonderful job they have been doing of cleaning up trash.
- 4: We are asking students to move from tables after 30 minutes in order to make tables available for others that are eating at a later time.
- 5: The first few times will be chaotic until students figure out when to eat and when to participate in other activities.
- 6: Students may go outside at any time during this our and may eat anywhere else in the building except the gymnasium and the auditorium. If after a few times your child is having difficulty finding a seat or a place to eat, please reach out to their counselor and we can assist.
- 7: Our counseling department will be available during this hour . Our prevention specialist and our CAS and EE coordinator will also be available.
- 8: It is critically important to know that the Lunch and Learn hours, 6 times in 12 days, is sacred time for our staff to meet and be available for our students. We will not be holding any meetings with parents, other community members, or other district entities during this time. It is our commitment to be here for our students.
- 9: It is also important to know that teachers can require students to meet during the teachers learn period if the student needs to make up any work or is struggling.
- 10: Consequences for misbehavior during lunch and learn will be loss of the privilege and possibly additional student code of conduct consequences.

We are all very excited about this new venture and it is our belief that it is good for all students.


