- Make recommendation for next year and beyond
- Start times will not change in 2022-2023


COMMITTEE MEETING DATES

OPTIONS CONSIDERED


- Shifting the start and end times for Elementary and Secondary schools I hour later:
 Estimated Additional Cost: \$660,000
- Adding a 3rd bus run that would result in staggered start times for Marsh Creek,
 Elementary Schools, and Secondary Schools: Estimated Additional Cost: \$770,000
- Flipping the current Elementary and Secondary start times: Estimated Additional Cost: \$0
- Leveraging cyber/asynchronous learning to shift Secondary start times while keeping end times the same: Estimated Additional Cost: \$13,000,000
- No change: Estimated Additional Cost: \$0

PARENT SURVEY: THE ISSUE OF SCHOOL START TIMES IS IMPORTANT TO ME




As the parent of an Elementary student, I would have reservations about my child waiting for a bus earlier in the morning


As the parent of an Elementary student, child care would be a challenge for me if my child got home earlier in the day than they do currently



As the parent of a Secondary student, ending the school day later would significantly impact my child's after-school athletics/activities




How do you believe a change to school start times would impact the students you currently teach?
