Communicating in the Classical Language

- Read and understand passages of Latin composed for acquisition of content and language skills.
- Write phrases and sentences of increasing difficulty in Latin.

Gaining Knowledge of Roman Culture

- Demonstrate a knowledge of ancient Roman life/Roman history and apply that knowledge to Roman culture.
- Relate their readings of selected Latin texts to an understanding of Roman culture.
- Demonstrate knowledge of ancient Roman archaeological evidence, art forms, and artifacts to Roman culture.

Connecting with Other Disciplines, Expanding Knowledge

- Recognize and make connections with Latin terminology in the sciences, social sciences, history and technology.
- Connect their knowledge of ancient history and social and political systems to events and systems in the modern world.
- Connect their knowledge of the Latin language to their knowledge of literature and artistic achievement.

Developing Insight into Own Language and Culture

- Demonstrate the relationship of Latin words to their derivatives and cognates in English.
- Compare and contrast the language patterns and grammar of Latin to the structure and grammar of English.

Participating in Wider Communities of Language & Culture

- Recognize the influence of Latin on the specialized language of various professional fields and its use in the media.
