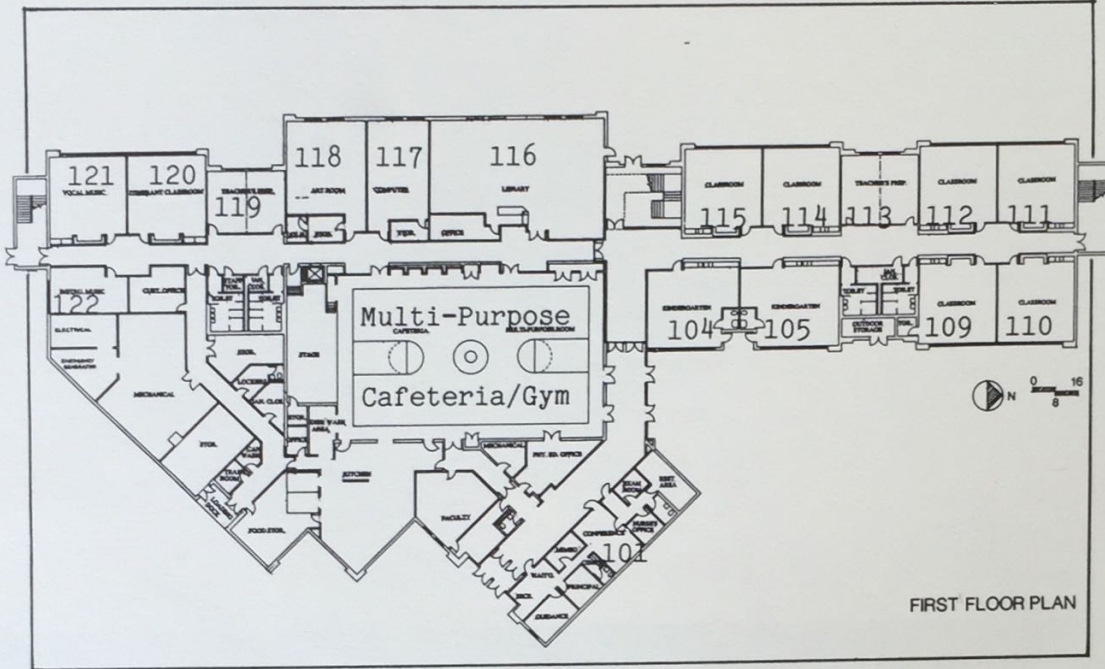
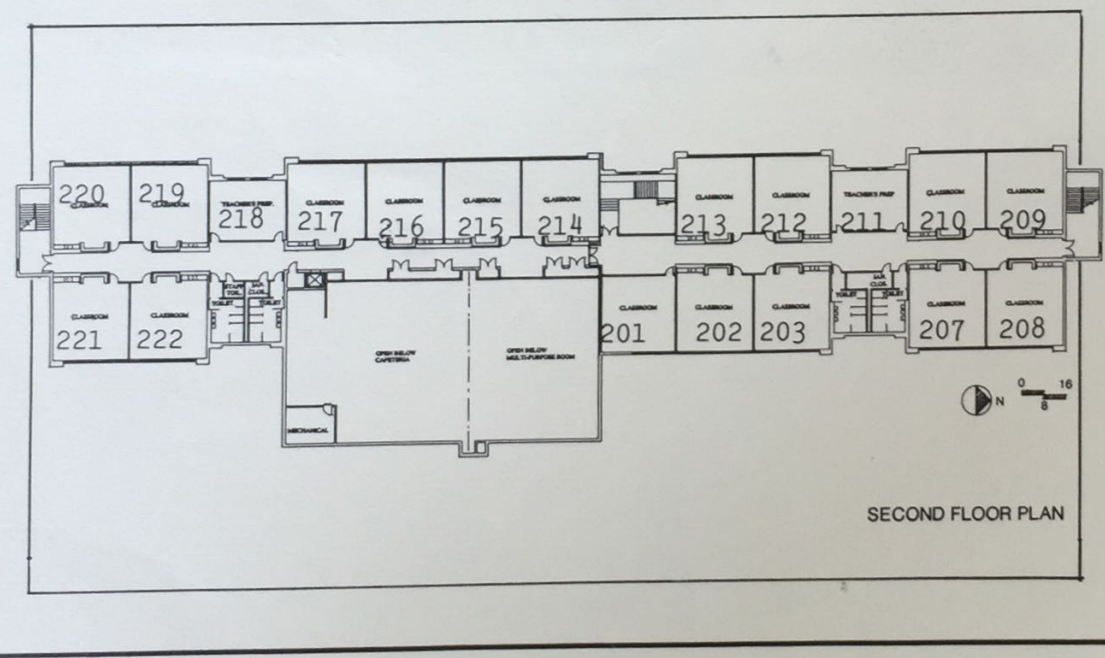

The Bradford Heights Elementary School stands a short distance from the original one-room schoolhouse, Bradford Heights School. Bradford Heights School was of stone-plastered construction and replaced Highland School, a one-room school building of frame construction. Bradford Heights School opened its doors in 1876 and closed them after 65 years, in 1941. It housed grades one through eight, and the highest enrollment reached 49 children.

Bradford Heights takes its name from the high ridge which lies south of Downingtown, in the northeastern corner of West Bradford Township. The ridge rises 500 feet above sea level and stretches approximately three-quarters of a mile east to west.
